And so much is for sure: As soon as the school re-opens, we will have a big party in our \*fC group atelier!



# ART HISTORY / THEORY BLACK AND PEOPLE OF COLOR\*PERSPECTIVES MAY 11<sup>TH</sup> - 15<sup>TH</sup> 2020 WITH RENA ONAT

Which Black artists and artists of color are known in art history? How do Black artists and artists of color use art to tell their own stories, to create alternative representations and to criticize racism within the art context?

The discipline of art history even today almost exclusively represents white male artists from (west-)european countries. **Artists of Color, Black artists and non-european artists have** largely been ignored by art history. What are mechanisms of exclusion that are at work within the art world? In the seminar we will engage with art and theory that highlight problems with racism within the context of art. What is "eurocentrism"? What is the white gaze in art? How are Black people and people of color being represented in art and visual culture? The term "representation" (Stuart Hall) helps to understand how visual images and racism are linked. How can racist and other stereotypes be deconstructed and changed? We will look at many examples and have discussions. We will look at art from Black artists and artists of color that helps us to understand criticism of racism in art and art history. Art can also be a means of empowerment for Blacks and People of Color. Within the seminar, you are also invited to present your own art work or introduce other examples.

\* The term People of Color is a self-chosen term by and for people who experience racism •

### ON LOVE AND PASSION - RADICAL DRAWING MAY 18<sup>TH</sup> - 22<sup>ND</sup> WITH MARINA NAPRUSHKINA

Drawing is a way to think, communicate and feel artistically. We want to ask ourselves the questions of what touches us, what we detest, what we want to support or criticize. From nude drawing of our own body to the design of posters. We get to know how and what other artists draw today and how they use drawing in different contexts: From an exhibition to

designing a newspaper or stop-motion videos



### RELATIONS IN DRAWING AND PAINTING MAY 25<sup>TH</sup> - 29<sup>TH</sup> 2020 WITH NADIRA HUSAIN

Drawings and paintings function as small worlds where multitudes of information and affects gather and interact. Your point of view as an artist meets the gaze of the viewer and echoes the context of your historical time and locality, as well as the art history you relate to. Your images stand in relation to their surroundings and their time, and aim to create links. During this workshop we will practice drawing while asking: How do we, as artists, connect to the world? The workshop is open to everyone, even if you are not familiar with drawing and paintings techniques.

Drawing is a basic tool every artist needs (to sketch your ideas for example). We will also be in conversation, develop critical thinking skills, look at and be inspired by the work of other artists and organize feedback sessions. You will need basic materials such as paper (a pad), pencils, colors, brushes that \*fC can provide, and any materials of your own ■



### THE QUICK FORMS JUNE 1<sup>ST</sup> - 5<sup>TH</sup> 2020 WITH MARKUES

The workshop 'The Quick Forms' presents techniques to quickly and immediately grasp and pick up your own artistic ideas, interesting moments and fleeting as well as intense emotions. In the individual sessions the participants choose and try out techniques such as sketching, noting, automatic writing, scribbling, collage, cutting, reinterpreting, appropriating and discussing their experiences with each other. In addition, one or two works of art are presented and discussed per session. The seminar will take place in five online sessions. You will need a notebook in which you can draw and write well (A5 or larger), pens to write and draw with, scissors and internet access •



### AGAINST THE ODDS EXPLORING THE POTENTIALITY OF ZINES JUNE 8<sup>TH</sup> - 12<sup>TH</sup> 2020 WITH MUDAR AL-KHUFASH

In this workshop, we will look at one curio self-publishing medium, THE ZINE. And the potential embedded in it to distribute ideas effectively, aesthetically, and at a low cost. We will also look at examples, how individuals or collectives, managed against the odds, to make space for themselves, in a new environment, to tell their stories and make their voices heard.

No software is required! Here all will be analog, and deeply personal •

And finally, what is the difference between still photography and motion-pictures as mediums? Duration and absolute? Where does the meaning accrue in each of them?



We find it important that you at least consider applying to schools outside or close to Berlin (Potsdam, Halle, Hamburg, Jena, Dresden, Leipzig...), as this will raise your study chances a lot! Contact friends or ask around in the \*fC facebook group if you would like to talk to someone who already studies art or design in Berlin or another city •



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
